

Educationally Related Mental Health Services (ERMHS) Funds

The purpose of these funds is to provide educationally mental-health related services for students with or without an individualized education program, including out-of-home residential services for emotionally disturbed pupils, pursuant to the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and as described in the California Education Code sections 56836 and 56836.07

Starting the 23-24 school year the state and federal funds will flow directly to LEAs using ADA from the 22-23 school year.
