

HOW DO I GET INVOLVED IN THE COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE?

Decide if you want to represent the district or come as a parent.

Talk to the Principal, Superintendent, or Program Specialist for your child's school about your interest.

If you want to represent the district the Superintendent will need to get school district board approval. This is a simple process.

WHAT DOES THE CAC DO?

HERE ARE A FEW RESPONSIBILITIES, BUT IT IS NOT LIMITED TO THIS.

Inform and advise the SELPA staff regarding to community needs, aspirations, and goals for individuals with special needs.

Encouraging community awareness and involvement through activities that support individuals with special needs.

Facilitate communication between schools, parents, and the community.

Assist with the development, amendment and review of the Local Plan for Special Education.

WHAT DOES A SPECIAL EDUCATION LOCAL PLAN AREA OR SELPA DO?

SELPA's ensure a full continuum of services are available to all special education eligible students within its boundaries.



WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE?

The community advisory committee or CAC is an important part of an effective special education program in California.

The CAC serves as an advisory committee to the administration and governing board of the Special Education Local Plan Area or SELPA.

Each member district school board in Glenn County SELPA is responsible for appointing a parent to participate and vote as a representative of their school district.

CAC Meetings are open to the public. While only SELPA governing Board appointed CAC members can vote, all are encouraged to attend and comments on items.
